escape the performance of a duty so unpleasent.
The Collector is satisfied that the government
has been defranded out of a large amount of revence by the parties against whem these proceedings have been taken, and hence it became his
imperative duty to bring the matter before the
procer authorities.

The proprietors of the establishments seized did not seem to be at all taken by surprise, and in no instance was there the slightest resistance to the officers of the government. They had evidently got an inkling of what was about to take place.

The seculon further provides that the proceedings to enforce the forfeiture of said property shall be in the nature of a proceeding for ren., in the Circuit or District Court of the United States for the district where such schure is made, or in any other court of competent jurisdiction.

The hereweries above-named have been placed in charge of seven deputy collectors—air having tharts of two contracts and the sevents having tharts of two cashs.

incharge of seven deputy collectors—six having charge of two each, and the seventh deputy being assigned to the remaining one, which is a very large establishment. All work has been suspended, and no goods can be removed from the premises without the permission of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue. It is thought that some arrangement can be made by thought that some arrangement can be made by which the stock on hand can be sold and the proceeds paid over to the Government, but the whole matter rests with the Commissioner.
