THE BEAR CREEK BAILROAD. The act chartering the Bear Creek Rail-road Company passed at the last session of the legislature. The corporators are Messrs. Rawle, Vincent and Douglas, of Eric, Grif-

fith, of Mercer, and Bredin and Kerr, of Butler. But where and what is Bear Creek ? many a reader will ash. Bear Creek is a considerable stream, but of no great length, which rises in the northeast corner of Butles county, and discharges its waters into the Allegheny river, in Armstrong county, some eight or ten miles above the Brady's Bend Iron Works. For a mile or two above its mouth it flows through a rough an rugged strip of country, which, in by-gone times, was very likely a favorite resort of bears; but above that the country is not at all calculated to excite bruinish thoughts. Coal and iron ore abound on Bear creek and as carly as 1818 a company erected a large iron furnace, adapted to the use of coke, near the mouth of that stream. Its manager was an English gontleman named LEWIS, who was something of an enthusiast, and hoped to revolutionize the iron business of this country by the introduction of the use of coke, a thing at that time hardly thought of. But for some reason the onterproved a failure. The same furnace was afterwards contracted and successfally operated with charcoal, and it may be neration ver for aught we know. Perhaps Mr. Lewis's fond dream of making iron with coke bas at length been realized on that spot, as it has been on a very large scale at Brady's Hend. Bear Creek, how ever has very little to do with the railroad which bears its name, and of which we pro-pose to speak, except that its eastern termitus is on its bank, about two miles from the Allegheny river, and the same distance from the line of the Mah.ning and Frank lin Railroad, which is but a continuation o the Allegheny Valley, road.

The Bear Creek Railroad is to commence at a point between a little village on the Pittsburgh and Erie Railroad, called Sharns burg, and Greenville, a flourishing town in the western part of Mercer county, near the Ohio State line, where the Atlantic and Great Western Railroad crosses the Pittsburgh and Erie road. From this point the line runs eastwardly, directly through th heart of Mercer county, and by the town of Mercer-enters Butler county near the northwest corner, and passes entirely across

This was a very liberal programme for the rebels. The President did whe not to offer it.
