"FOUR YEARS OF FAILURE!" The Chicago Convention of last Augus demanded that "after four years of fallure to restore the Union by the experiment o War," there should be an immediate cas

The "four" years of the war had at that time scarcely exceeded three; the fourth year will be up on the 14th of April, the anniversary of the day when Sumter was fired upon by the Charleston Rebels. And where is the Malieroph supera. Charleston is ours, Summer is ours, Richmond is ours, and the larger part of the revolted States is in our possession. Davis is a fugitive; the Rebei Government is broken up; its armies are scattered; and the flag of the Union once more floats over nearly every State that ever belonged to the Union. Can any man look back at this glorious result and call it "four years of failure" without a

The "cessation of hostilities" will follow our four years of brilliant success; and eriainly every true American will rejoice that Peace, at last, has been brought about through victory and the success of ou arms, rather than, as the Chicago Convention would have had it, through Igaomin ious submission and a confession of defeat. THE GUNPOWDER PLOT.

Now that Richmond is taken the rebels will begin to deny their many heartless crusities and the flendish spirit that prompted all their acts towards the Union men that fell into their hands, and it is therefore well to put on record the following confession made in the report of a committee of the Rebel Congress upon "the condition and treatment of prisoners held by both Governments. One strocity charged against the labby prison is admitted to be true, and defended.
