When our fathers of these British colo ies declared their independence of the British crown, and took their place among the astions of the carth, as the United States of America, they-founded their political temple upon the cardinal principle that "ALL MEN ARE CREATED EQUAL This principle, thus solemnly put forth, is, and was designed to be, in direct antago alam with slavery, not only as an abstract principle, but as an existing institution. It ed, not as a rhetorical flourish, not The pite a postic traism, but as a supreme law, to be carried into execution in good faith. Bo Massachusetts accepted it, and by its simple and direct force, without any further legislation, her slaves were manumitted. Other States acted upon the principle with mere or less promptitude, until slavery was either, totally abolished, or in process of abolishment, in all the States north of Maryland, before the close of the last century. By the ordinance of 1787 it was for phibited in all the territory of the ever pr

of the African slave trade, and for a clause in the Constitution providing for the rendition of fugitives from other States, both of which they got by way of compromise. That was the fatal mistake, the precedent for all future compromises, and out of that grew the "irrepressible conflict" which culminated in this great rebellion and war. Barly in the present century the cotton

gin was introduced, and by the immense extension of the culture of cotton resulting from that investion, slavery became very profitable. Soon men ceased to apologise for it, but cast about for arguments upon which it could be justified and defended on principle. Step by step this process went on, until that which in 1818 (was acknowl edged to be an evil and a curse was found by Southern theologians, and by many in the North, to be in strict accordance with the divine will and law in 1830, and by Southern statesmen to be essential to the highest development of social life and civil-isation." Arrogance, talschood and blasphemy went hand in hand on one side of the great controversy; while for a long time the side of friedom was maintained only by a few despised and personated mon. By and by shat arrogance became so intolera-ble and exsitting, that the nation was slarmed and aroused; and took what was then regarded as a high resolve that slavery should by held sacred where it was already establish.
