It is impossible for our builders to con tract for one half the houses that are wanted this season, owing the scarcity of hands. All the builders have now more work on hand than they can possibly do with their present force of en, and they are compelled to decline king any new bids for work. It is estimated that ample employment could be obtained here for two bundred and fifty or three hundred additional carpenters, at prices ranging from two and a half to three dollars per day. There are eral churches, many warehouses and mills and b-tween one and two hundred dwellings, to be built just as soon as parties can be obtained to take the contracts. But notil more work-men can be obtained, these improvements must be pertypened.

There is an impression in the community that the reason way so few buildings.

There is an impression in the community that the reason why so few buildings are being erec red is, that expitalists and others are waiting for a decline in the price of labor and meteriats. No doubt many 1 crossos of limited means are destricted from building in consequence of the high cost of lumber and warge; but hundred are ready and anxious to build at any cost. Saveral cases have been cited us, in which the most liberal indecements have been cited of the contractors by parties desiring to build, but they could not get their bids taken, owing to the scarcity of hands. Very allow progress is not being made on the work now on hand, owing to the same cause, and until there is a very large increase in the number of workmen, houses will continue scarce and cents will rule high. increase in the number of workmen, houses will continue scane and rents will rule high.

There are numerous instances in which parties have urged contractors to bid for buildings, but without success. A gentleman residing in Allegheuy offered to a contractor a margin of five thousand dollars on a private dwelling, but the contractor refu cd to undertake the job. Another gentleman, wishing to erect a block of tenements for rent, desired a builder to go work on them, without stipulating any price, but the same insuperable objection eams upcan't get the hands. We might cits many similar instances, but those will smifted. There is no l. ck of disposition to build, and no desire to hold off for lower prices, except in a few instances. There are not enough carpenters in the cities to do the work offering. We do not know how it may be in other cities, but such seems to be the fact to far as our community is concerned.
