Now swppose the government were to declare LEE and his army released from military parble, thrown back within the pale of civil life and made, amenable to civil law, what would be his status! Would he be a cilizen? Certainly not; for he speaks of another country to which he and they were devoted, and which, as long as it existent all, stands in an attitute of active hostility to this country. Would he be an alien? No; for that presupposes some other sovereignty, to which he holds allegiance. It follows, then, that if Lee can claim neither of these positions, he is simply an outlaw. This would be his status, were all his past evinies pardoned and forgotten. It is argued that, by the terms of the surrender, General LEE and his officers are not amenable to civil process for treason. This is true, so long as they remain prisoners of war ; but as the war is over, and the robels hold no prisoners for whom they can be exchanged, the Government may, if it chooses, release them at once, or it may hold thom in that condition for life. If released, they isso the protection which their parole gives them, and can no longer claim immunity from arrest and civil process. If they retowards the government, subjects them to the punishment of death under military law. Now it is a question whether the utterance of the seditious words we have put in stalecs was not, under the circumstances, a breach of the conditions of his parole, and whether it would not clearly justify the Coverament, at the very least, in revoking it, and feaving him exposed to the awful penalty he has incurred as a traitor.
