"No man can serve two masters." no man can owe allegiance to two sovereigns at the same time. If LEE elt that his paramount allegiance was due to Virginia when he took office under the ational government, he perjured himself at the moment. He was a traiter then, and when he followed Virginia in its treason he but developed his true character, it matters not how sincerely he may have hugged

his heresy to his heart.

If this man is to be permitted to run at large in Virginia, and propagate at will such po litical doctrines as he has been preaching since his surrender, he will be able to de more to injure the government and revive freamn than he did while at the head of his semy. He, by his utterances, has defied trust he shall no longer be permitted to abuse the privileges he enjoys under his parola. Let him at once be released from It, and be left to answer to the civil law for rimes in which he seems to glery. He stands as a bar to justice in all other cases. No other rebel, JEFF DAVIS perhaps excepted, is so prominent, so responsible, so inexcusable, so defiant or so guilty. If he goe inpunished, no other robol can be punished justly.
