THE VIEWS OF THE PRESIDENT. The following is an extract from the reply of President Jourson to the Pennsylvania elegation, who waited upon him for the purpose of assuring him of the cordial sup-port of Pennsylvania in his great work of utting an end to rebellion, and to that out which rebellion sprung. The President's reply will, we think, satisfy the most ardent ver of justice, and the most timid conser vator of the public safety, that the work is in the right hands. And what is better still, we know that he is attesting his faith

by his works. The President, in the course of his remarks, said:

The words you have spoken are most fully and cordially accepted and responded to by me. I, too, think the time has arrived when the people of this nation should understand that treason is a crime. When we turn to the catalogue of crime, we find that most of those contained in it are understeed; but the crime of treason has neither been generally understood nor generally appreciated as I think it should be; and there has been an effort, since this rebellion commenced, to make the impression that it was a mere political struggle, or as I see it thrown out in some of the papers, a struggle for asceadency of certain principles from the dawn of the Government to the present time, and new settled by the triumph of the Federal arms. If this is to be a dotermined, sottled idea and epinion, the Government is at an end, for no question can arise but they will make it a party issue; and thon, to whatever length they carry it, the party defeated will be only a party defeated, and no crime attaches thereto. But I say treason is a crime, the highest crime known to the law, and the people ought to understand it, and be taught to know that unless it he f his remarks, said:

law, and the people ought to understand and be taught to know that unless it be considered there can be no Government I do not say this to indicate a revengeful or impoper spirit. It is simply the enunciation of deliberate consideration and temperate independent

ation of deliberate consideration and temperate judgment.

There are men who ought to sufferthe penalties of their treason; but there are also some who have been engaged in this rebellion who, while technically speaking, they are guilty of treason, yet who morally are not—thousands who have been drawn into it, involved by various influences, by conscription, by dread, by force of public oplinon in the localities in which they lived—these are not so responsible as are those who led, deceived, and forced them. To the unconscious, deceived, conscripted—in he unconscious, deceived, conscripted—in hort, to the great mass of the misled—

me intolateurs, deceived, conscripted—in short, to the great mass of the misled—I would say mercy, elemency, reconciliation, and the restoration of their Government. To these who have deceived—to the conscious, influential traitor, who attempted to destroy the life of a nation—I would say, on you be inflicted the severest penalties of your crime. (Applause.]

I fully understand how easy it is to get up an impression in regard to the exercise of mercy; and if I know myself and my own heart, there is in it as great a disposition to mercy as can be manifested on the part of any, other individual; but mency without justice is a crime. In the exercise of mercy, there should be deliberate consideration and a profound understanding of the case; and I am not prepared to a higher court, a court where mercy and justice can best be united.

Steamers for Italy.

An enterprise is on foot to form a line of steamers between this country and the Moditerranean coast. The company has been chartered by the State Legislature, and the incorporators include the names of Charles M. Wilkins, George Mackay, Hiram Dixon and William E. Hagan, of New York; N. B. Bryant, of Boston, and James Pollock and J. H. Walton, of Philadelphis; and H. D. Foster, ex. Governor of Pennsylvania, and Hiram Barcey, Osborne Macdaniel, G. F. Secchi de Cassali and E. E. Kendrick, of New York.

The Italian government, desirous of extending its relations with this company, has given a special grant for the formation of this line, guarantees four per cent. on the eleven million dollari capital, and will pay the cempany a fair rate for the transmission of mails.

The steamers of this line will run between this chy, Madeira, Cadiz and Genoa. Tourists and others will thus be enabled to proceed direct to Spain or Italy, without passing through England or France as hitherty. For Americans going to Rome, Naples and the East, this will be in every respect the most advantageous route, while it must prove influential in largely increasing our commerce in the South of Europe.
