Think of the rich mines and the productive soil which still lie unproduc tive in the far west, because bracticably inaccessible. Two railroads to the Pacific. one by the northern route and another by he central, would do more for the prosperity, the growth and the stability of this mighty empire than would the liquidation of one half the national debt, and bring to light more gold and allver, to say nothing of other things, than would pay the whole

We hold that, except in case of some extraordinary and unforeseen contingency, the national debt ought not to be suffered to erease. But the means to pay are increasing rapidly. JAY COOKE, in a late publican an the wealth, resources and power of the People of the United States," makes a calculation, based upon the assumption that the wealth of the nation will continue to increase in the same ratio that it has increase ed during the past two or three decades and upon the returns of the last census, tha the aggregate wealth of the pation this year (1865) is 16,112 millions of dollars; that in 1870 lt will be 24,218 millions: in 1880. i it will be 48,436 millions. He estimates that at the last mentioned date, based upon the same ratio of increase, the annual products of the national industry will be 13,059 millions: upon which the interest of the na tional debt, at 0 per cent, will be a tax of only about 14 per cent.; while at present it is over 8 per cent. Relatively, therefore, nal debt will be reduced more than one half by the year 1880, without the payment of a dollar of the principal.
