Oxicics produced so much wax in ancient times that the Romans imposed upon it an annual tribute of 100,000 pound weight. annual: tribute of 100,000 pound weight. Subsequently the inhabitants revolted, and they were punished by the tribute being mised to 200,000 pounds weight annually, which they wereable to supply. Wax is to honey as one to fifteen, so that the inhabitants must have gathered 3,000,000 killogrammes of honey. When Coraica became a dependency of the papal court, it paid its taxes in wax, and the quantity was sufficient to supply the consumption not only of the churches in the city of Rome, but these in the papal States. Brittany likewise supplies a great quantity of honey, but of inferior quality so that of Corafos. This sanday value of the finites and wax produced in that province is satimated at 6,000,000f.

The laying down of the new Atlantic cable will probably be attempted in July, On April 24th, fontreen hundred miles had been stored on board the Great Eastern, and the work was proceeding at the rate of iwenty-five miles a day. Electricians are kept constantly employed in passing currents through the cable, and every foot is subjected to the severest tests. The weight of the cable is 400 pounds to the nautical mile, while that of 1858 weighed only 261 pounds.
