It is not within the limits of an ordinary newspaper article to give such a detailed description of the vessel as her magnitude and importance would seem to demand, but we will endeavor to briefly give some of the main features of this great and powerful ship. The principal dimensions of the null are as follows: Length, 390 feet 4 inches; heam 73 feet 10 inches; depth of hold, 32 feet 7 inches; height of casemate lastice, 7 feet 9 inches; length of ram bow, 50 feet. Her draft when ready for sea will be 21 feet; her displacement is 7,000 tons; registered tomage, 5,000. The war armor will weigh about 1000 tons. The boiler surface is 30,000 feet, the grats surface 1,200 feet.

The condensing surface is 12,000 square feet. The supines are horizontal, back-action condensing, with two 100 inch cylinders, and 45 inches stroke of piston. The propeller is 21 feet in diameter, and has a varying pitch of from 37 to 30 feet, and weighs 34,880 pounds. The coal bankers will accommodate 1,000 tons of coal, sufficient for ten or diffeten days' steaming.

The armor on the side of the vessel is three and a half inches thick, and placed vertically on sibts from twelve to fifteen feet in length and three feet wide, screw boiled.

The casemate which aumounts the hull is plerced for twenty-one guns, and is a marvel of strength and roominess.
