TRADE AND CAPITAL. The idea prevails extensively that a full and abundant circulating medium cause high prices, but the very opposite is neares the truth. It is true that when the supply of money is in excess of the tentiremen of business such a result may be expected but this is a state of things that has neve been witnessed in this country. The flood of unsound, irredeemable paper Issues that Were thrown upon the country during the war of 1812-15 was not composed of what may be dignified with the name of money; for as it had neither inherent value nor solid basis, it was swept away upon the return of peace, and for eight or ten years the country was left almost entirely destitute of any medium of exchange; and even as late as 1826, after a sound currency had grown up under the auspices of the Bank of the United States, it was still wretchedly deficient in volume, so that a very large part of the

credit and parter. It is curious to revert to those queer old times when the idea of doing business on the cash system never entered people's heads. The former had grain in his fields, or barn, or stacks, or bins, while the "store keeper" had merchandize of every kind. An exchange was either expressly or tacitly agreed upon, and a long book account was the result, to be settle by the delivery of the aforesaid grain at market prices within some not unreasonable time. The very large issues of currency renderhave filled the channels of circulation with money (or a substitute for money) which. instead of tending to worthlessness, as did the money of the former war, is steadily and certainly appreciating, and will, sooner. or later, reach the standard of coin. This has led to two good results: it has brought about a very general adoption of the cash system in business, and it has greatly roduced the aggregate sum of individual in-debtedness. Indeed it is estimated that the sum total of individual indebtedness has been curtailed to, an amount equal to the national debt. : Now as the former was an Evil uncompensated by any countervailing benefits, and as the latter can be used as the basis of an abundant, safe and permanent "mational currency, it follows that our altered condition is, take it altogether, an improved c ndition; and that all that is required now to ensure an abiding prosperity is to husband our monetary resources so that we can develope our natural resources.

In the very peculiar condition in which this country finds itself at this moment, every thing depends upon keeping not only our gold but our national securities at home, and so employing them as to render our boundless resources-which are utterly valueless in their undeveloped conditionvaluable and conducive at once to individual and national prosperity. But if we suffer foreigners, and a few of our own people, under the delusive cry of free trade, to send our national securities, toge her with our gold, to Eurore in exchange for things which we can and ought to make ourselves, we thereby undermine at once our currency, our prosperity, and our national solven-We are now in an admirable condition as regards our currency; but unless Congress shall stop the vents through which our life-blood is now escaping, we shall not be able to say that very long.

How much currency (paper and coin) does such a country as this need? This is a question that is easier asked than answered; but we think it is safe to say that it never had enough before the late warnever enough to exable the people to adopt a general cash system in their business transactions, big and little-never enough to enable them to live without giving credits and contracting debta. True, we have say that money was too plenty; but it was fifulness, unsteadiness, and not over-abundance, that drew forth such complaints. Indeed it would be difficult to assign limits to the amount of money that could be legitimately, safely and profitably employed, to the mutual benefit of people and government, in such a country as this so extensive, so full of natural resources, and occu-pled by a people of unequalled intelligence and energy. Could we only induce our rulers to establish and maintain a common sense commercial policy, half the skilled and nnikilled laborers of Europe might come here and find more profitable employment than they can find at home.
