JOINT STOCK COMPANIES.

New England, and particularly Massachusetts, is for the most part a hard and rocky soil, and has a cold climate, subject to extreme variations of temperature, and exposed to the damp mists which are brought down from the hills, and from the water of the sea. It is not surprising that it was about the last place we should look for a rich and prosperous people. Yet the people of Massachusetts are probably the wealthiest in this country, taken as a whole, on this continent, if not in the world.

Although Massachusetts does not grow much wheat as supplies its own wants, yet its agriculture is very profitable, because there is a good market for everything that the soil produces, right on the spot. Potatoes, turnips, beets, pumpkins, grapes, &c., are all produced abundantly and pay well. Fruit is grown very largely, and great care and attention are bestowed upon it. This, too, is very profitable, because there are plenty of people to buy, and its value is not frittered away in freight and commission.

But were farming and the raising of stock and fruit growing the main dependence of the people of Massachusetts, they would be poor indeed. It is because so many of her people do not cultivate any of these things, but depend upon their business, that she is so rich. As the beautiful farm-houses, adorned with shrubbery, enclosed with neat palisade fences, and in all directions, are to be seen, every where attest. It is in the busy manufacturing villages, scattered all over the country, that the secret of all this comfort and refinement is to be found. It is here that the money which has been made in other parts of the world has been brought to Massachusetts.
