We learn that Eastern gentlemen heavily interested in the Pennsivania Central Railroad, and other roads connecting with it, have purchased one-half interest in the Union Pacific Railroad, leading from Wyandott in Kansas through Lawrence towards the West. These gentlemen and others connected with the Ohio roads are new in this city to make arrangements by

others connected with the Ohio roads are now in this city to make arrangements by which there will be a thorough connection between the Union Pacific Road via the Missouri Pacific, the Ohio and Mississippi, the Little Mismi, the Columbus and Pittsburgh and Pennsylvanis Central roads to Philadelphia. The connection, it will be observed, involves St. Louis, and insures the passage of the great Continental traffic from the Atlantic and Pacific through our city. The sale of half their road supplies the Union Pacific Company with means to prosecute their road, and they now confidently expect to have it finished to Fort Riley-by the 1st of June, 1868.—St. Louis Dispatch.
