The deep, bitter hatred shown by the white people of the South towards their former slaves is one of the strongest reason in favor of withholding political franchise from those who show themselves so niterly incapable of exercising them properly. I shows that the time has not yet come for restoring political power to the conquere rebels, and that it may be a long time, perhans a reneration hence, before it will b ent to bring back the revolted State to their former place in the Union. The telegraph brings us intelligence daily

of outrages perpetrated upon the blacks by their former masters, in all parts of the South, and the mail comes to us laden with the sorrowful stories of the poor creatures who are thus victimized. In one place we have a negro mother shot down for daring to rush to the defence of her child; in another locality the entire body of negroes is hunted with blood hounds and exterminated en masse; in another, the blacks are hunted up by the half-dozen and cruelly whipped; and in another they are driven away from the fields they have culdivated and left to starve. Time and space would fail us to relate all these cases, and it would be heart rending to our read ers if we could lay the whole matter befo them. The comparatively few details al ready given are sickening enough, God knows; and they are sufficient, because

Portions of such lands have been made government farms, which are cultivated by the reedmen under the management of agents

of the Bureau.

Probably the most urgent and importan task before the officers of the Bu eau is to protect the freedmen from outrage and oppression, which are now too common in the South. Gen.
