They do not, in the simple language of all our Free State Condeclare that slavery shall not exist in the State; but that slavery having been abolished by the General Government Blavery shall not exist, &c. They do not, they would have us understand, abolish it themselves, but they merely submit to what has been done because they cannot help it. At the same time they give unlimited power to the legislature to "provide for the protection and security of the persons and property of the freedmen, and guard them and the State against coils that may arise from their sudden emancination."
