The Ohio Convention is careful to have it understood that State-rights do not include the right to seecde, but that it includes th sight to do everything else that a sovereign State may do. The government of the United States has no rights, whatever; everything in the shape of rights belong ne States, saving only the right to secede. The idea of their having that right seems to have been thoroughly knocked out of the democracy both North and South.

The one issue mon which they mean to try this doctrine of State Rights, just now, is the right of each State to tax Uni ted States bonds and recurities at its pleasure. Tine, Congress has exempted these bonds and securities from State and municipal taxatlon; but they assert and intend to maintain that the Sintes, individually, are superior to Congress, that they can, if they ose; and will, if the democracy can, nullify this act of Congress; and that the right of the States to levy taxes cannot be imited by Congress. In other words, that the States, separately are superior to the

United States 22 200 They fancy this will be popular. They that taxation will be burdensome, and imagine that they will win the taxpayers to their aids by holding out the idea of the relief that might be afforded by taxing the Government securities. This, with hetred of the negro, upon which they reckon largely, will, they hope, restore them to ghout the North.

Such is the Democratic programme. It has been very quickly arranged, and it is, perhaps, the best that these defeated enemies of the Government can do.
