NOT NEGRO QUATITY, BUT EQUAL REPRESENTATION.

The following passage occurs in the Constitution of the United States: "Representation and direct taxes shall be apportioned among the several States, according to their respective numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole number of free persons, three-fifths of all other persons."

This provision of the Constitution has been the means of giving greater power to the South, than all the legislation of Congress since the institution of the Federal Union.

It is in accordance with this provision, that the country has become accustomed to elect twenty or thirty members of Congress representing slaves, not it is true chosen by them, but elected by their masters and owners, and legislating always to strengthen and perpetuate the shackles of their constituents.

Now, that the slaves have become "free persons" they will be entitled to a representation in Congress in the Electors equal to or equal to the population. But inasmuch as the apportionment for representatives was made in 1850, the representatives will be represented "in full," as all other free persons are.
