The Late Shooting Affair at Hay's Coal

The Courier's full sitting on the late shooting affair at Hay's Coal Works, in Baldwin township, re-assembled yesterday afternoon, and the coroner's inquest was examined, who decided in the fact that William Faulkner, employed at the works as watchman, had been shot by any of the witnesses. No one was elicited by any of the witnesses.

The jury, after a short consultation, rendered the following verdict: "That the deceased Thomas Madden, was killed by a bullet fired from a pistol in the hands of Frederick Faulkner, at the time he was in the discharge of his duty as watchman for May & Davis, in Baldwin town, the said Faulkner was shortly thereafter arrested.

Faulkner had been on parole, with instructions to report if Madden should die from his wounds, and he did so, but was held in custody until this morning, when he will be committed to the penitentiary. His trial will doubtless be drawn up in the case, which will be brought before court for examination.

The master of the coal works, Mr. May & Davis, came to this city to dispose of the products of their mine, and whom it goes without saying, had among them large sums of money.

At an early hour on last Friday morning, the body of Thomas Madden, was found hanging by his belt, in the yard of the coal works, where he resided, lying on the ground on Fifth street, east side, near the corner of Bedford, the body being in a state of decomposition.

The coroner's jury were about these: "The deceased, about one hour before the body was found, was in the employ of May & Davis, and started on Fifth street.

He stated that he had been sent to Crystal Palace, which was from the works of Taylorson, and that he had two sons who had been sent to him, and had been sent to work at the Crystal Palace.

At the time of his death, the Crystal Palace, was at a standstill.

His body was found hanging in the deep depression between the coal works and the Crystal Palace, with a sprig worn on his coat, and a small pocket knife.
