ident of Brown University, in Providence, R. I., died, on the 30th, of paralysis, aged 69 years Few of our college presidents have won and re tained a more envisher fame than Dr. Wayland, or have left their labors with a better record for the further instruction of their pupils. He was born in New York, March 11, 1796, and his father was a clergyman from Great Britain. He graduated at the Union College in 1813, entered Andover Theological Seminary, was a tutor in Union under President Nott; pastor of a Baptist church in Roston; and in 1826 Pro Mathematics and Natural Philosophy in Union College. In December he was chosen President of Brown University. He built up the institurospecty. In 1842 he published "Thoughts on the Collegiate System of the United States," and resigned the Presidency in 1840, stipulating that the college should be reorganized to include commercial, mechanical and agricultural class-. The sum of \$125,000 was raised, and the sh thus made effectual. From 1855 he had esn engaged in literary labors and as pastor of a Baptist church in Providence. Dr. Wayland will be better remembered as an author than as a teacher. He published "El-

ments of Moral Science," "Elements of Political Economy," "University Sermons," "Limitations of Human Responsibility," "Life of lev Adoniram Judson, D.D." "Intellectual Philosophy," "Notes on the Principles and Practices of Baptists," "Occasional Discourses," Sermons to the Churches," and a corresponence carried on with Rev. Dr. Puller, in 1815, styled "Christianity and Slavery," in which President Wayland bitterly opposed slavery and nan of very studious habits, as the list of his works sufficiently attests, and his works on moral science and political economy were long and still are text books in their departments in many institutions and colleges.
