It appears that before 1836 a treaty was made between the State authorities of Pennsylvania and Complianter, the chief of a tribe of Indiana inhabiting that section of the State. What motive induced him to make this selection is unknown, but of the fact itself the best evidence can be produced, the treaty conveying the title being now in Pulladelphia.

Some time afterward, however.
