The General Anniversary of the Sunday chool Union of the M. E. Church, took place last week in New York. Hon. M. F. Odell presided. Rev. Dr. Wise read the annual report, from which it appears (en years since there was 10,469 Bund sy Schools onnected with the M. E. Church and the Union. Now there are 13 891. Increase 2,822 schools. Ten years ago there were 2,022 senons 201 years ago facts were 118,150 officers and teachers. Now there are 162,745. Increase 39,586. Ten years since there was 579,126 sholars. Now we have 917,932. Increase, 339,806, or nearly sixty per cent, in a decade, which includes four years of rebellion. It was also stated that 190,560 conversions in the schools had
