If every southern convention should unanimously repudiate the entire rebel debt for themselves and for posterity, what assurance or guaranty have we that future conventions may not alter their constituti nd future Legislatures make provisions for the payment of this debt? Is not the alacrity with which the southern legislators repudiate what they regard as honest claims upon them some credence that they reserve to themselves such action in the future? If modern legislation was like that of the Medes and Persians there, would be no difficulty, and we could safely leave the subject with these Southern States. But if, after admission, they should alter their constitutions so as to permit the assump. tion of this debt, there is no power known to our government to restrain them. It is not then in the several constitutions of the Southern States that we will find se-curity sgainst the payment of the rebel debt, but in the constitution of the United States, and in that slone The party of the Union has two-thirds of Congress, and the Legislature every Northern State. Within ninety days from the meeting of Congress, an amendment to the national Constitution, declaring the rebel war debt forever null and void, can be ratified by all the loyal States of the Union; and by the requisite three-fourths in due season. Then this dangerous question will obtain a repeal of such an amendment, to the latest generation. It will be easy enough,

on the contrary, to alter State Constitutions and assume the debt. If the Southern States are sincere in their willingness to repudiate their debt, they can give no better evidence of their good faith than by adopting such an amendment. If they will not favor it, they prove that their present action is dishonest, and that they adopt ordinances of repudiation merely to gain admission to the Union, and
