A recent pretentious special telegram from Harrisburg to the New York and Philadelphia newspapers announced that some English gentlemen had resolved to establish in that borough a steel manufacfory on so large a scale as to furnish employment to affeen hundred skilled workmen; that in furtherance of this enterprise, or rather, as a condition precedent thereto, the citizens of the borough had subscribed fifty thousand dollars to the capital stock required for the undertaking, and had, in adtion, donated fifteen acres of valuable and on which to erect suitable buildings.

This inflated arnouncement elicited consorious or humorous comment here and elsewhere. The tone of the announcement, and the admitted conditions on which the docation of the enterprise, was determined, are alike confessions of the subordinate position held by Harrisburg as a manufacturing centre. But compliance with such terms indicates a commendable disposition on the part of the citizens to aid in the development of industry and help the increase of

the borough in activity and population.
