That was a rearor two ago; and now we find a legislature gasembled under the same constitution, at Richmond, proposing to throw that election aside, and to elect John Minon Borrs and the rebel General AndERSON, of the Tredegar works, in the place of the two above

If the legislature now in session at Richmond has any authority at all it derives it from the Alexandria Constitution; and if that instrument has any authority at all, the election of Messra. Underwood and SEGAR was legal and cannot be set aside. On the other hand, if the election of Un-DERWOOD and SEGAR was without authority then the degistature now in session at Richmond has no legal existence. There is no escape from this conclusion.

But what care the Virginians for logic or Constitution? They do not like the poliics of Underwood and Segar, and therefore determine to select others whom they

do like. The case is the same in Louisiana. The present Legislature has chosen RANDALL, HUNT and Judge Boyer as Senators, although the previous Legislature, acting under the same constitution, had chosen Mcesrs. HAHN and CUTLED as Senstors. These attempts to set aside previous elections unpalatable to the present rebel rulers of the South, indicate what succeeding Legislatures will do, when their States get back into the Union, with the present legisation (weak and insufficient as it is) in favor of the freedmen.
