Afternoon Dispatches.

Washington, Jan. 5.

Treasurer Spinner was taken quite sick
yesterday evening and forced to retire from
his desk at the department. He has been
exerting himself much lately in the exercise
of office duties.

Gen. Grant will return to Washington
this evening.

The public debt statement will be issued
about Friday, but it cannot be definitely
stated what reduction will be shown. Dur-
ing December \$5,760,000 was issued to the
Pacific Railroad Companies, \$4,849,999 being
to the Union and the balance to the
Central Pacific.

A claim agent named D. V. Ruff has been
arrested in this city by officers of the Secret
Service Division of the Treasury Depart-
ment charged with attempting to commit
fraud upon the Government by presenting
claims to the Quartermaster General's Office
which have been already paid.

Memphis, Jan. 5.

Numerous outrages by militia having
been reported here Gen. Granger sent Capt
Pope with 250 infantry to investigate them,
but he reported he was unable to trace them
to any reliable source.

A meeting of refugees from Arkansas was
held here yesterday, and Col. D. C. Cross
presided. After considerable discussion it
was resolved to hold a meeting to-morrow
at Monard City, and Gen. Granger and other
United States officers were requested to
attend.

Geo. R. Butler, of Tennessee, was brought
before Judge Hunter yesterday afternoon.
The trial began but was not concluded.—
But, however, was reduced to \$3,000. The
trial will be concluded probably this evening.

Trenton, Jan. 5.

The joint railroad companies have accep-
ted the terms laid down by commissioner
for the purchase of Harpers at Jersey City
and have paid \$500,000, the sum demanded
by the State.

The warrant for the execution of Wooley
at Freehold on the 7th inst., has been signed
by the Governor.

Binghamton, N. Y. Jan. 5.

The grand opening of the Albany and
Saratoga Railroad will take place on the
12th inst., at which will be present Gov.
Hoffman, the Legislature, the Erie Railway
officials and others. A banquet and other
ceremonies will take place.

Elizabeth, N. J., Jan. 5.

Commodore W. D. Salter, U. S. navy,
died after a lingering illness of rheumatism
of the heart, on the 3d, aged seventy-four.

Port Chester, N. Y., Jan. 4.

C. Wheel, of East Port Chester, a mem-
ber of the Connecticut Legislature, from
Greenwich, mysteriously disappeared on
Saturday night last.

Cincinnati, Jan. 5.

A solicitor will go to Columbus to-morrow
to press upon the Legislature a bill to in-
crease the city limits.
