Afternoon Dispatches.

Madrid, Jan. 7.

Republican demonstrations at Seville and
Frontiera were unsuccessful.

Attempts were made at the latter place to
seize arms, but the arms had been removed
to Cadiz for safety by Gen. Rola's troops.

Paris, Jan. 7.

Later advices from Baragony state that
American Minister McMahon had a satisfac-
tory interview with Lopez, and full atone-
ment has been accorded for the recent out-
rages on Americans.

Augusta, Me., Jan. 7.

The Legislature organized yesterday by
the choice of J. B. Drummond as Speaker
of the House and S. B. Lindsey as President
of the Senate. The Governor's inaugural
will probably be delivered to-morrow.

Harrisburgh, Jan. 7.

The Governor's message was delivered
yesterday. He spoke of the prosperous con-
dition of the State finances, showing the
debt is annually diminishing, and recom-
mends retrenchment in every department.—
The common schools are in a satisfactory
condition, but he estimates that seventy-five
thousand children in the State are without
school facilities and urges the improvement
and also an increase in the salaries for
teachers. He urges the adoption of meas-
ures to prevent fraudulent naturalization.—
He alludes to the case of Hester Vaughn and
other prisoners under sentence of death for
whom warrants have never been signed,
and suggests a law allowing the Governor
to commute the death penalty for a term of
years.

California, is attended by twenty-six Chinese-
men.

A young man in Wisconsin has been fined
five dollars for winking at ladies in the
street.

In one year Calcutta's trade in opium
amounts to several millions of pounds ster-
ling.

The supplies of the military hospital at

year 1899.

sold his orange crop, numbering 200,000, for
\$4,000.

of Prussia commuted twenty-two capital
sentences.

in the streets of St. Joseph, Missouri, on
Thursday.
