# TELEGRAPH

REPORTED FOR THE DAILY RECORD.

## Afternoon Dispatches.

New York, Jan. 8.

The report of Postmaster General Randall on the union of the telegraph with the postal service was sent to Congress yesterday. He recommends the government to unite the two systems. He says: A thorough examination of the subject has satisfied me that the department can arrange for the reception and delivery of messages. Furnish stamps and keep the accounts without any great increase in the number of clerks. That the business may be made the source of revenue to the government and that the efficiency of the country postmasters may be increased by employing them in connection with the telegraph. He recommends that Congress charter a company to contract with the Government to transmit and deliver messages at low and fixed rates by the plan submitted by Gardner C. Hubbard, and submits a bill to carry out the plan.

The steamship Bremen sailed for Bremen yesterday.

Montreal, Jan. 8.

At the quarterly meeting of the Board of Trade a long discussion took place in regard to a twenty foot channel said to exist between Montreal and Quebec. Resolutions were passed requesting the Harbor Commissioners to take the earliest and most active steps practical to ascertain whether such a channel is fit for use.

The feeling was unanimous in favor of a change in the act respecting the inspection of flour so as to make it agree with the New York system.

The Catholic Bishop, with a number of the clergy, leave for Rome on the 29th inst.

A portion of the roof of the Drill shed gave way with the weight of snow Wednesday night.

Paris, Jan. 7.

The Sublime Porte has sent a communication to this city asking a postponement of the Conference on the Eastern question for eight days, in order that instructions may be prepared for the representation of the Turkish Government.

Chicago, N. H., Jan. 8.

The Republican State Convention met today, Gov. Harriman Chairman. The chairman made a lengthy address.

Oswego Stearns was chosen as the candidate for Governor by acclamation. He briefly addressed the convention.

Madison, Wis., Jan. 8.

The lively stable of A. J. Fisher was destroyed by fire this morning. Loss about \$5,000.

A little child of J. Bawn was run over by the cars at seven o'clock this morning. Both legs were cut off below the knee.

Boston, Jan. 8.

Yesterday afternoon a large wheel in the Boston rolling mill in Cambridge, broke while in rapid motion, killing Henry Patchell and Alfred Sherwood, and badly injuring Patrick Conroy, all employed in the mill.

Ex-Judge Wm. H. Leonard having declined the appointment of Justice of the Supreme Court of the city of New York, Gov. Hoffman has appointed John J. Freedman to fill the vacancy.

Chas. Easton, one of the most esteemed cotton merchants of New York, died Monday night in his sixty-fifth year.

James Tallent, the man who surrendered himself to the police of New York, on New Year's day, has been fully identified as one of the assailants of Mr. Rogers, who was murdered in front of his residence on Thursday last.

The Legislature of Nevada met at Carson on Monday, and organized by electing J. D. Edwards, of Ormsby county, President of the Senate; D. O. Atkinson, of Storey county, Speaker of the House.

The total number of arrests made by the police of St. Louis during the past year was 12,819; males 9,041; females, 2,878. The money stolen and stray property recovered and restored to owners during the year amounted to \$114,438.

Certain country districts oppose being annexed to Cincinnati. It is thought they can be induced to consent. A committee is now pressing this matter on the Legislature.

Ben Micky and Thomas Looney, charged with the murder of the shoemaker Beardon, at Lagrange, Kentucky, have been held to answer before the Circuit Court.
