The Teeth of a Horse.

At five years of age a horse has forty teeth—twenty molar or jaw teeth, twelve incisor front teeth, between the molars and incisors; but usually wanting in the molar.

At a year old the incisors are all visible on the first or milk set. Before three years the permanent nippers have come through.

At four years old the permanent division front teeth, between the molars and incisors; but usually wanting in the molar.

At five the mouth is perfect, the second set of teeth have been completed.

At six the hollow under the nipper, called the mark, has disappeared from the nipper, and diminished in the dividers.

At seven the mark has disappeared from the dividers, and the next teeth, or corners, are level, though showing the mark.

At eight the mark has gone from the corners, and the horse is said to be aged. After this time, indeed, good authorities say that after five years, the age of the horse can only be conjectured.

But the teeth gradually change their form, incisors becoming round, oval and triangular. Dealers sometimes mishap the teeth of old horses; that is, scoop them out to imitate the mark; but this can be known by the absence of the white edge of enamel which always surrounds the real mark, by the shape of the teeth, and other marks of age about the animal.—Rural Gentleman.

The first thing that strikes a Yankee abroad is the greater individuality of the races which he meets; the greatest personal independence. We are like paving stones on the beach, the wave of the old despotism and feudal system left the corners on; if it produced one tier of slaves it produced another tier of men.—Therefore the first thing that strikes an intelligent Yankee when traveling in Europe is that he has got into a land of unscrupulous and unmanly men, where little regard is paid to the opinion of those around them.

An American conceals the claws of his conviction in velvet until he feels round and finds out the average public opinion, and then he takes care not to compromise himself, while an Englishman, on the contrary, is so blunt that we almost deem him uncivil.—Wendell Phillips.

Augusta, Me., Jan. 9. Gov. Chamberlain was inaugurated yesterday. The debt of the State has been reduced the past year thirty-seven thousand dollars. The entire debt amounted to five million \$89y-three thousand five hundred dollars, which falls due in 1871.
