Afternoon Dispatches.

Concord, Feb. 13.

John Mitchell, of Cutton, is under arrest charged with an attempt to murder his wife by throwing a bottle of kerosene into the fire, burning her in a shocking manner.

Worcester, Feb. 13.

The case of Pike, charged with poisoning his wife, was again before the Police Court at Fitchburg yesterday, but examination was continued to the 20th inst.

Washington, Feb. 13.

James Lyons, of Virginia, yesterday in the Supreme Court argued in behalf of that Commonwealth to show that it was an inherent right in the Court under common law to issue a writ of prohibition, for which application has been made, setting aside the decisions of Judge Underwood, he having discharged three convicts, two of whom were sentenced to death, on the ground that the State Judges were disqualified from exercising judicial functions under the Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

Springfield, Mass., Feb. 13.

Major General Barns, U. S. A., died at his residence in this city yesterday morning. He was one of the Commissioners of the Pacific Railroad.

Altoona, Pa., Feb. 13.

The Vindicator printing office of Mr. Kerr, and a frame dwelling belonging to Mr. Borkakity, was burned yesterday.—Loss 25,000.
