## Afternoon Dispatches.

Atlanta, Ga., Feb. 20.

A mass meeting of Conservative Republicans last night was broken up by a packed crowd, led by Attorney General Farrow. Judge Dunning was called to the chair, and a resolution adopted that Georgia was not reconstructed, and Congress had not kept its word to Southern men. Dr. Bard of the New Era, supported by leading Conservatives, entered a protest against the proceedings. The Conservatives held another meeting Saturday night in the Legislative Hall, which was today tendered.

Four hundred and twenty-six boxes of tobacco were seized today, together with 160 barrels of whisky, for violation of the revenue laws.

Chicago, Feb. 20.

For insulting his wife a citizen demanded satisfaction of his family physician, whereupon the doctor struck the injured man five times with a slung shot leaving him almost insensible. This morning, at the Police Court, the doctor was let off with a fine of \$10, while the citizen paid \$5 for being the aggressor.

Snake-Bite Antidote.

During the month several opportunities have been taken advantage of for bringing to test the effect on the human subject of a remedy advocated by Professor Halford, after trying its effect on some dogs, considering the result sufficiently encouraging to publish it as a probably effective remedy. Three or four weeks ago a man named Seymour Smith, in the neighborhood of Beechworth, was bitten by a snake, and although the usual remedies were resorted to, he appeared to be rapidly sinking and likely to die. Dr. Dempster, under these circumstances ventured to try the injection of ammonia into a vein, and the man rallied immediately; and although his system had sustained a severe shock, he is now in a fair way of recovery. Last week the remedy was again adopted, under the eye of Prof. Halford, in the case of John Brown, the station master of a certain railway station, who was poisoned by snake-bite in the hand. The ordinary means and even the application of a vacuum failed in effect, and symptoms of an alarming nature appeared. It was determined to inject ammonia into a vein of the wrist. The effect was marvelous. In a very short time the patient became sensible, and continued gradually to improve, all symptoms of coma disappearing. The manner in which the operation was performed was as follows: An incision was made through the skin, exposing the superficial radial vein, and the point of the syringe being introduced into the vein, the injection was completed. It really would appear that a very valuable and easy remedy against the fatal effects of snake bite has been discovered. [Melbourne Argus.]

A coal cutting machine of a new form, worked entirely by hydraulic pressure, has been presented for examination to the London Institution of Civil Engineers, by Mr. Chubb, who claims it to be a great improvement in respect both to economy and efficiency, over any method now employed. The arrangement consists of twelve plungers, set side by side on a steel bar, connected with a hydraulic pump, and so arranged as to be capable of extending into the coal about three feet and a half. A pressure of about twelve tons to the square inch can be exerted. The apparatus has been tried in Wales, and it is stated that with it two men can readily break down twenty tons of coal in an hour, the whole in large pieces, with no waste.

The old pine coffin which contained the remains of Mrs. Serrat from the day of her execution until they were removed, a few days ago, has been standing in the store of the undertaker in Washington, since the remains were taken from it. A number of gentlemen called to see it and one of them, in lifting the lid to get a view of the inside, accidentally threw off the trestles on which it was standing, and as the wood was much decayed from having been so long buried, the box broke to pieces. A scramble at once ensued, each one determined to obtain a relic. By this time it is presumed, very little of the old coffin is left to the undertaker.

The English War Department have thrown aside the Armstrong gun altogether, after spending untold millions and knighting the inventor. The British War Office has issued an order intimating its purpose to withdraw all the breech-loading rifle guns and substituting muzzle-loaders.
