REPORTED FOR THE DAILY RECORD.

Afternoon Dispatches.

Toronto, March 11.

A violent snow storm set in yesterday morning and continued through the day. The despatches from the east and west describe it as the most severe snow storm of the season.

Montreal, March 11.

A heavy snow storm has been raging here since yesterday morning. No mails have arrived today and mails for the United States were dispatched to St. John's in sleighs.

Springfield, March 11.

First train through from Montreal for the week arrived yesterday and the road is now open.

Indianapolis, March 11.

Silas Hartman, the young murderer who made a bonus confession Tuesday, committed suicide in jail yesterday.

Baltimore, March 11.

Andrew Johnson will have an extensive reception here to-day.

Concord, March 11.

One hundred and forty-one towns gives Stevens 4,738 majority for Governor. Nine of the twelve senators are Republican.

Augusta, Me., March 11.

The Senate yesterday refused to pass the Constitutional Act—12 against 14.

Cleveland, March 11.

A safe in the Custom House was robbed night before last. Only three hundred dollars were taken. No arrest.

Havana, March 11.

The cholera has entirely disappeared in the vicinity of Santiago.

Negroes have tendered their services to Gen. Butler at Santa Lucia.

The insurgents are burning plantations in the vicinity of Mansilla and Santa Cruz.

Boston, March 11.

A benefit prize fight, according to the rules of the ring, except that hair pulling and biting were allowed, took place between two women in Somerville, Mass., at an early hour on Monday morning. The contestants in their appearance in the ring were clad in the conventional costume of guitars stockings and drawers, wearing nothing else to speak of beyond waist falls and curles. At the very first round one of them, named Sarah Chapman, became frightened and jumped out of the ring, but her backers drew her in again and she eventually won the fight. At the 21st round her opponent, Mollie Jones, both of whom having been severely punished, begged her seconds in God's name to take her away and so the fight and money (\$50) was awarded to Sarah.
