## Afternoon Dispatches.

Chicago, March 16.

Wm. Praton, a respectable man living at Madison, Illinois, shot himself through the head with a revolver on Saturday, killing himself instantly. No cause is known for the act.

A destructive fire occurred at Anoka, Minn., on Saturday night. It consumed eight buildings on Front-street, involving a loss of \$20,000, with an insurance of \$5,000. The fire was probably the work of an incendiary.

London March 16.

The Duke of Montpensier declares that he does not seek the Spanish throne; that should he be chosen King he will accept the crown, but he wishes that the question of his election may not be made the pretext for civil war.

A deputation with the Mayor of Dublin at its head, proceeded to Windsor Castle yesterday and presented to the Queen a petition praying for the dis-establishment of the Irish Church.

Detroit, March 16.

The Board of Trade yesterday adopted a memorial to the Legislature, recommending the transfer of the Sault St. Marie Ship Canal from the State to the Federal Government, if so doing will procure an enlargement of the Canal.

Milwaukee, March 16.

Capt. W. L. Lenard, a citizen of Sparta, Wis., was waylaid and robbed Saturday night, after being shot three times, and left for dead. His condition is very critical.
