Afternoon Dispatches.

Concord, N. L., March 17.

Full returns from all but three small towns give Stevens, for Governor, 45,760; Debell, 31,996.

London, March 17.

A slight shock of earthquake was felt in the eastern part of Lancashire yesterday morning. No damage.

San Francisco, March 15.

Savage and Smith, who murdered Lieutenant Commander Mitchell, U. S. N., in October last, were to-day sentenced to ten years respectively in the State's prison.

Indian outrages are reported in Humboldt county, California. One man while ploughing his field was shot and killed by the savages, his house plundered and fired, and his family barely escaping by flight.

Immediate pursuit was made but the Indians escaped to the mountains.

Late Arizona advices say: Intelligence of Indian depredations and murders are numerous. The people are becoming exasperated and war and extermination are suggested, commencing with Indians on the reservations.

St. Louis, March 16.

The steamer Ruth, which was burned on Monday in the lower Mississippi river, was one of the largest and finest vessels on the western waters.

An addition will shortly be made to the fleet of American merchant steamers now running on the rivers of China, two steamers intended for inland navigation in that country having left New York for Shanghai, proceeding thither by way of the Cape de Verde Islands and the Cape of Good Hope.
