Afternoon Dispatches.

HAVANA, March 16.

Telegrams from the City of Mexico of March 8th are received by steamer from Vera Cruz. The rebel Gen. Negrete has not been heard of since his flight.

The rebels in Potosi had conceded petition to Gov. Bustamante.

A church in Seaside Gas was struck by lightning on the 5th Inst., and was destroyed. One hundred persons were buried in the ruins.

Aureliano Revere was killed in a duel with Gov. Garces.

Chavez has been assassinated by his companions.

Cespedas, Governor of Yucatan, died at Merida.

The reported appointment of a minister to Washington proves not true. Mavaro, Mexican Consul at New York, will not be one of the Commissioners under the treaty with the United States.

St. Louis, March 17.

A counterfeiter's den, about four miles from the city, was discovered yesterday and some fifteen thousand dollars in bogus city treasury warrants and a lot of fifty cent United States fractional currency, tools, press, &c., found. A woman living at the place was arrested, but no man has yet been caught.

The result of an analysis of a new hair lotion described by its vendor as "perfectly innocuous" shows that this precious mixture is composed of rose-water, sulphur and sugar of lead, the latter in sufficient quantity to cause paralysis, or painter's colic.
