Afternoon Dispatches.

Auburn, N. Y., April 2.

The cotton factory of L. W. Nye, Hawlett and Haffey, burned, took fire yesterday. The interior burned out, and a large amount of property was consumed, but the goods from the first and second floors were principally removed. Insurance on building, \$10,000; building valued at \$25,000; machinery insured for \$41,000. The machinery and stock was valued at \$50,000.

River Water.—The Allegheny river has again been filled bank full. On Thursday the river was at its height, covering part of the flat below the mouth of the creek, at Oil City, and backing the water up the creek so that they encroached on Seneca street. Some of the cellars on Centre street were filled with water. The river is falling today. Damages very slight.

Opinion in Brazil is favorable to a gradual emancipation of the negroes. There are extensive mountain districts of that vast empire that have long had no interest in the preparation of slavery.
