Afternoon Dispatches.

Washington, April 8.

The Pacific Railroad Committee cannot finish their investigation of the affairs of the Central Pacific Railroad Company during the present session. They will tomorrow commence an arrangement by which testimony may be taken during the recess, so that the facts can be reported early in the next session.

Washington, April 8.

Rear Admiral Hall writes from Havasu that the Captain General of Cuba has sent his request for orders for the passage through the lines of the Spanish troops and American citizens and their families from the interior.

Mr. Coblington, American Consul at Cubas, has been released from imprisonment on the charge of conspiracy, at the instance of the Admiral.

Mrs. Emily Chandler and one hundred and fifty-four other women have sent a memorandum to the Massachusetts Legislature against woman suffrage, believing that it would subvert the purity, the dignity, and the moral influence of women, and bring into the family circle a dangerous element of discord, without securing any increase of strength, efficiency, or wisdom to the government of the nation, and ask to be let alone in the condition allotted to every nature, by custom and by religion."

A correspondent of Philadelphia Monthly asks why it is that when a woman applies for a situation at the shop of our great manufacturer her moral character is always inquired into, while the same question is never asked of a man. The editor of Philadelphia thinks this should not be. That a woman who has shamed and fallen should not be in consequence driven from more. Says the editor in effect: But we fear it will always be so, for though man may forgive her, woman will not.
