REPORTED FOR THE DAILY RECORD.

Afternoon Dispatches.

Washington, April 8. The Pacific Railroad Committee cannot finish their investigation of the affairs of the Central Pacific Railroad Company during the present session. They will tomorrow commence an arrangement by which testimony may be taken during the recess, so that the facts can be reported early in the next session.

Washington, April 8. Rear Admiral Hall writes from Havana that the Captain General of Cuba has at his request, from orders for the passage through the lines of the Spanish troops, and American citizens and their families from the interior.

Mr. Cokington, American Consul at Ocho, has been released from imprisonment on the charge of conspiracy, at the instance of the Admiralty.

Mrs. Daily Chandler and one hundred and fifty four other women have sent a remonstrance to the Massachusetts Legislature against woman suffrage, believing that it would diminish the purity, the dignity, and the moral influence of women, and bring into the family a wife a daughter, a sister or a friend, without the normal strength, efficiency, or wisdom to the government of the nation, and ask to be left alone in the condition allotted to their nature, by custom and by religion.

A correspondent of Packer's Monthly asks why it is that when a woman applies for a situation at the home of one of our merchants her moral character is always inquired into, while the same questions are never asked of a man. The editor of Packer's thinks this should not be. That a woman who has sinned and fallen should not be in consequence driven from home, says the editor in effect. But we fear it will always seem, for though man may forgive her, woman will not.

Petroleum Centre, April 8.
Shipments of oil from this point, April 7, for the O. C. & A. R. Railroad were 14,000 barrels. The market up to 2 o'clock the market has remained inactive, offers were being made at \$5.50, while holders were asking \$5.60 to \$5.75. The late onset of the New York and Cleveland buyers has caused a fall in the market. Both buyers and holders appear very cautious in their transactions. The Eastern market today is reported dull and weak. New York shows a decline of 1/4 on refined, while that of Philadelphia exhibits a decline of 1/4 on April 8th, with the market dull and nothing doing. At Pittsburgh 11 1/2 was offered, but holders were not disposed to take less than 13.
