We have repeatedly said that it was utterly impossible for the Cuban revolutionary party to capture Havana by an insurrection in the city, as all the guns of the great system of fortifications bear directly on the place. But if it be true that the Cubans have possession of a couple of monitors, probably armed, the case will be greatly simplified. There will be no difficulty in a small fleet of iron clads capturing the city.

We are informed by telegraph that unusual preparations are being made in Georgia and other Southern States for planting this year. In the States of North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, Texas, Arkansas and Tennessee, there were planted in 1868 two million more acres of corn than in 1867, and the increase this year is said to be still greater.
