## Afternoon Dispatches.

New York, April 22.

Justice Dowley commenced on Tuesday at the Tombs an examination in the case of the late forgeries upon Jay Cooke & Co., by which \$2,000 was obtained from the National Bank of the State of New York. Affidavits were submitted by the Assistant Cashier of Jay Cooke & Co., and the paying teller of the bank, declaring the checks to be forgeries.

Washington, April 22.

The Secretary of State was yesterday notified by the Foreign Relations Committee that Pile and Carlyle were not acceptable as Ministers to Brazil and Belgium. Fish said he would notify the President.

Buffalo, April 22.

The Grand Trunk is entirely under water between here and Brantford. The express train which left here yesterday morning was obliged to return. So far the freight has not suspended travel on the Great Western Railway.

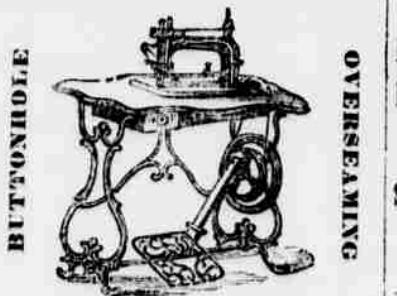
