#### Prize Fight.

Jim Gallagher, of New Haven, had a prize fight with Andy Hartley, of New York, on the shores of Long Island Sound, about six hours sail from New Haven, yesterday. Gallagher won the battle, after forty-three rounds were fought.

Alliance Between England, France and Spain Against the United States.

Washington, May 13.

There is the best authority for saying that the President has decided to recall, within a few days, Mr. Morris, Minister to Turkey. It came to the knowledge of the President that Mr. Morris expressed openly his sympathy with those governments hostile to Turkey, and in consequence the United States did not exercise as much influence with the Sultan's government as it should. Petitions were received here from Russian bankers and merchants, praying that Mr. Morris be retained. Baron Stoekel, Russian Minister, made a similar request to Secretary Eliot.

New York, May 13.

The Tribune's special London dispatch says: Initial steps have been taken for an alliance offensive and defensive between England, France and Spain against the United States. The rejection of the Alama treaty, the tone of Sumner's speech, the alleged filibustering tendencies of Gen. Grant's Administration, and the reports of military expeditions from the United States against Cuba, being made the pretext for a necessity for such an alliance.

Buffalo, May 12.

Mrs. H. E. Daly, personating Juliette at the Academy of Music Monday evening accidentally caught her dagger in the folds of her dress, penetrating below the left breast, driving a rib and breaking off the point of the dagger. The wound was severe but not dangerous.
