MR. MOTLEY AND THE ALABAMA CLAIMS. The London Times of the 29th ult., bas a leader commenting upon the appointment of Mr. Motley and the proposed renewal of negotiations on the Alabama ciaims. The cable briefly referred to this article a tew days since in such terms as to excite much anxiety to see it. The article is in good temper throughout, though the regret is repeatedly expressed that the Johnson Stanley treaty was not accept d by the Americans, respecially as Mr. Seward (as keen a diplomat as any country could desire) had accepted it as a finality." AN ALLIANCE TO SAVE CURL TO SPAIN. The impression is very general in Europe that Napoleon is auxious for an alliance with England to protect Spain In her possession of Cuba, and further that this dealeed alliance has its origin in hostility to and jealousy of the United States, to whom Cuba will naturally fall, through the medium of annexation, should the ever faithful late secure its independence. The London correspondent of the New York Herald, writing under date of April 28th, has this to say on this subject;

"There is a general impression here that General Grant will strive to inaugurate a truly American policy and to carry it out to a practical result before the close of his administration. It is thought that Cuba would be the staring point of this new departure, and every day news of a movement upon Have a looked for, with a rem Spain for the outrages committed upon American citizens. Whatever foundstions there may be for these expectations. it is certain that never was the time for an American policy more ripe than at the present moment. The anglety of the French Government in regard to the Antilles has been met coldly on the part of England. There is good authority for the statement that on Monday last Lord Lyons informed the French Emperor in a semiofficial manner that public opinion in England was decidedly opposed to war, and especially to any chance of war with the United States, and that Her M jesty's Ministers could not for a moment entermin the question of a foreign alliance for the defense of the Antilles. So far as England was concerned Spain must make the best of the situation in which she had placed her. self by her own footleb and impolite action.
