St. Louis, May 19.

A day late dispatch of Monday says: At ten o'clock yesterday morning DeLoach Young broke the first ground on the United States Railroad, near Webar river, immediately below Osage City. It is expected to reach this city by October next.

John Clem, of Ohio, the drummer boy who dropped his drum for a musket at Chickamauga, and shot a rebel Colonel who demanded his surrender, and was subsequently wounded in another engagement, has been appointed a cadet at large at West Point, by the President. He was but twelve years of age when he beat his drum, and is scarcely seventeen now. Clem was quite a hero at Chattanooga, about the time Gen. Grant arrived there. The regular officers in a certain sense adopted the little fellow with a view of giving him a chance, and we presume he owes his present appointment to their interest in him.
