The scene was imposing.

Dayton, O., May 20.

A fire broke out in the Whipple House frame building, about four o'clock this morning and entirely destroyed it. A man named Wilkinson was burned to death and several others seriously burned, one supposed fatally. There were some thirty-five persons in the house at the time, who escaped by jumping out of the upper story windows, the fire originating under the stairway, thus cutting off their means of escape. Supposed to be the work of an incendiary.
