Death of Henry J. Raymond.

New York, June 19. This city this morning was shocked by the sudden death of Hon. Henry J. Raymond, of the New York Times. He was at his office till 6 p. m., yesterday in normal health, and during the evening he took a walk with his daughter. At three this morning he was found insensible in the hall of his residence and at five o'clock expired. It is supposed of apoplexy.

The Post gives the facts of Mr. Raymond's death, from the best authority, as follows: Mr. Raymond, accompanied by his daughter, went to Greenwood Cemetery yesterday evening for the purpose of selecting a family plot. He intended to have the body of one of his children, who died a few weeks ago, removed from the vault and re-interred. He returned to the Times office about five o'clock and remarked to the associate editor that he never felt better in his life, except a slight feeling of fatigue consequent upon his long walk through the cemetery. He left the office about six o'clock and proceeded to his residence in West Ninth street, where he remained until about nine o'clock, to recover from the fatigue of the evening. Mr. Raymond left the house about nine o'clock, remarking to the members of his family that he had an appointment to attend a political meeting. He was seen shortly after walking up Broadway, and one of two friends, who stood in front of Wallack's theatre, noticed his elastic step and general appearance of robust health. After attending the meeting, Mr. Raymond returned to his residence about 11 o'clock, and as soon as he had closed the door after him he fell heavily upon the floor. None of the inmates of the house heard the fall, however, having retired for the night. About 3 o'clock this morning one of Mr. Raymond's children became restless, and upon becoming fully aroused remarked that she heard some person breathing heavily. The persons in the house were immediately awakened, and on descending to the hallway Mr. Raymond was found extended on the floor entirely unconscious, breathing heavily and apparently with great difficulty. He was carried to his room, placed upon a bed, and physicians sent for. Four physicians arrived soon afterwards, who examined him and pronounced him beyond all medical aid. They also declare the case to be apoplexy. Mr. Raymond lingered in unconsciousness until five o'clock, when he died, surrounded by the members of his family. He passed away apparently with but little pain. The news of his death caused much excitement and very general regret throughout the city. All downtown hotel, and newspaper offices displayed their flags at half mast as a mark of respect.

The Associated Press today adopted resolutions expressive of profound sorrow at the death of Mr. Raymond.
