Sales 5000 bbls standard white first half of month, 34 1/2, 9000 bbls 4th to 24 1/2, 500 bbls for last half of month, 35; 25,000 bbls for month 35. For Philadelphia delivery, 500 bbls first half Nov 24, and 500 bbls Dec 24 1-2.
