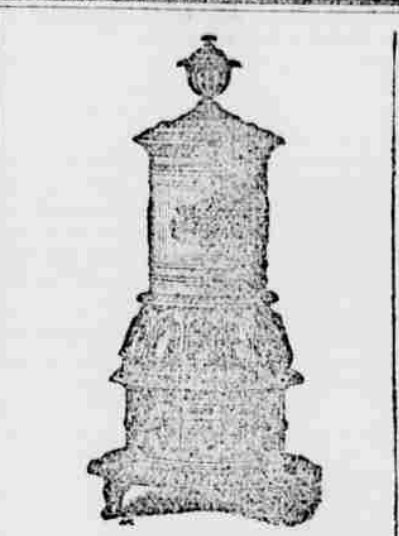

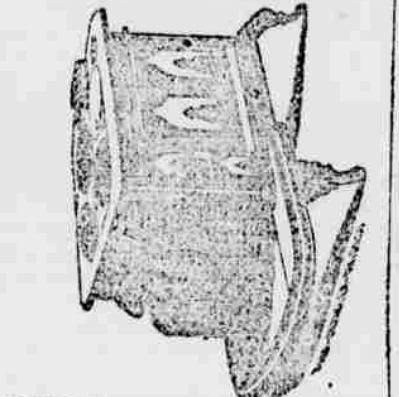
Veranda Hair-Dressing, BATHING ROOMS.
