Refined weak owing to limited inquiry, not much on sale. 1600 bbls standard white Jan'y. 31<sup>st</sup>; case oil more sought after and have to note sales of 1600 cases 37<sup>th</sup> and 1000 bbls 39. Philadelphia delivery, lower prices current with very limited demand, sales 1000 bbls refined S. W. Jan'y 30 and 1000 bbls ditto Feb. on private terms.
