The Internal Revenue Bureau has directed that ofter May 1st, 1870, all adhesive stamps used upon lostruments, writings and Internal Revenue Laws, shall be cancelled by the person affixing either by writing upon each and every stamp, in ink, the initials of his name, and the date year, month and day upon which the same is attached or used; or by cutting or cancelling the same by a certain machine approved by the commissioner. This regulation has been made on account of the extensive frauds alleged to have been committed by washing, and using internal adhesive revenue stamps which have been cancelled by the "stamp ribbon machine." The Commissioner orders that after May 1st, 1870, no other method of cancellation than that first mentioned above shall be recognized as legal or sufficient.


