PETROLEUM CENTRE April 13

The market remains quiet with limited inquiry at \$4.15 to \$4.20. Sellers however, are firm at \$4.25.

Reports of all the Sales of Petroleum in New York Yesterday.

Petroleum market crude in bulk is held steadily 14 1/2% with moderate inquiry. 400 bbls were sold this price. Crude shipping order held 19 1/2% with fair demand. Refined, there is less tone to the market, there is some few orders from shippers, no special inquiry. We quote at 20 1/2% for standard white; a cargo of 2000 bbls sold at this price. Case has sold largely, business embracing 1700 cases on private terms, supported 20 1/2%. Philadelphia delivery, dull market with prices rather weak, no decided change; sales 500 bbls refined S. W. April 25 1/2%, 1000 bbls ditto ditto option (last half of May 25 and 4000 bbls for May and June at 26 1/2%.
